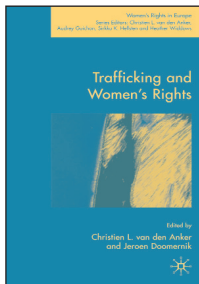

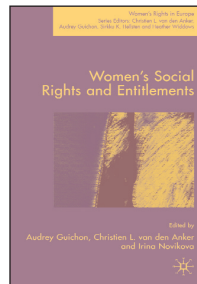
TRAFFICKING AND WOMEN'S RIGHTS

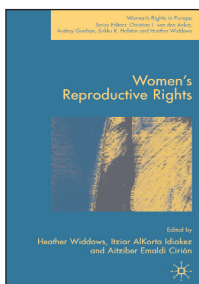
WOMEN'S SOCIAL RIGHTS AND ENTITLEMENTS

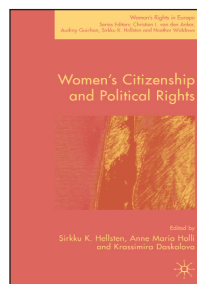
WOMEN'S REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS
