## COMMITTEE ON THE ELIMINATION OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN (CEDAW)

44<sup>th</sup> session (20 July - 7 August 2009) and Pre-session for the 46<sup>th</sup> session (10 - 14 August 2009) United Nations Headquarters, New York

#### States parties

The Committee will examine the reports of the following twelve States parties during its 44<sup>th</sup> session: Argentina (to be confirmed at a later stage by the State party), Azerbaijan, Bhutan, Denmark, Guinea-Bissau, Japan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Liberia, Spain, Switzerland, Timor Leste and Tuvalu.

The Committee will convene in parallel chambers, except for the consideration of the initial reports that will be considered in plenary.

#### **CEDAW** Committee members

#### **Decisions of the Committee**

Since its early sessions, the Committee has invited NGOs to follow its work and this is reflected in its rules of procedure. In order to ensure that it is as well informed as possible, the Committee and its pre-session working group, which prepares lists of issues and questions for replies to be considered at future sessions, welcome

representatives of national and international NGOs to provide countryspecific information on States parties whose reports are before it. This can be done orally or in writing. The Committee encourages international NGOs and United Nations organizations, funds and programmes to facilitate attendance at Committee sessions by representatives of national NGOs.

#### **Documentation**

### NGO reports for the Committee at its sessions

The Committee welcomes reports including country-specific information from NGOs. OHCHR posts these documents on its website, under the relevant CEDAW session.

All submissions to CEDAW should:

1. Identity the full name of the NGO;

2. Indicate the country to which the information relates; and

3. Be sent electronically in pdf format (not Word) <u>and</u> thereafter in 30 copies by post.

All submissions should arrive <u>two</u> weeks prior to the beginning of the session to the secretariat of the Committee.

#### NGO reports/information for the presession working group

NGOs are encouraged to submit their reports or other country specific information to the pre-session working group that prepares the list of issues and questions for each reporting State scheduled in two sessions e.g. the presession which takes place immediately after the 44<sup>th</sup> session will prepare the list of issues and questions for the 46<sup>th</sup> session. The pre-session for the 46<sup>th</sup> session takes place 10 to 14 August 2009, in New York. NGO representatives attending the pre-session working group should bring 10 copies for distribution at the meeting of the pre-session working group with the NGOs. NGOs not attending the pre-session working group should send 10 copies of their submissions two weeks prior to the beginning of the pre-session working group. NGOs can also avail themselves of the support of IWRAW Asia Pacific submit NGO information, to electronically and/or in hard copy, of their alternative reports to the secretariat. # NGO attendance at the Committee's 44<sup>th</sup> session or pre-session working group for the 46<sup>th</sup> session

The Committee has set aside time at its 44<sup>th</sup> session for NGOs to provide **oral** information in respect of countries being considered in the week ahead. (For further information, please see the provisional agenda).

Oral interventions by NGOs must be concise. On average, not more than 10 minutes overall are allocated for all NGOs wishing to intervene on one particular country. Efforts to share the available time amongst the NGOs wishing to speak on a country are encouraged and appreciated. NGOs making oral interventions should ensure that they bring 35 copies of their statements on the morning of the presentation. Prior to the presentation they need to send an electronic version of their statement to: cedaw@ohchr.org

The pre-session working group also provides an opportunity for NGOs to address it on <u>Monday 10 August 2009</u> for all the countries to be taken up at the 46<sup>th</sup> session.

#### **Accreditation**

NGO representatives who wish to address the Committee or its pre-session working group are requested to submit the full title of their NGO, the names of their representatives, and the proposed dates of attendance to <u>cedaw@ohchr.org</u> no later than <u>a week prior</u> to the beginning of the session or pre-session working group so that arrangements can be made for the issuance of United Nations ground passes to enter United Nations premises. To receive the ground pass, all applicants are required to bring

a valid national passport or government issued photo ID such as a driver's license or state non-driver's ID bearing a photograph, and appear in person at United Nations Pass and Identification Unit, located at 801 United Nations Plaza at the corner of 1st Avenue and East 45th Street. The office hours are 9.00 am to 4.00 pm. Mondays through Fridays. Please note that NGOs must bring their passports (or government issued photo ID) at every time they wish to enter the UN premises. Prior to this NGOs must contact OHCHR to be placed on the list of accredited by the secretariat. This should be done by email to cedaw@ohchr.org

During its sessions the CEDAW Committee considers reports of States parties to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women. consideration, Following such the Committee formulates concluding observations that assist the State under review in the further implementation of the Convention. These concluding observations outline positive aspects, principal subjects of concern and the Committee's recommendations on how to address challenges faced by the State party. #### Future sessions

#### 45<sup>th</sup> session

The 45<sup>th</sup> session will meet in January 2010 in Geneva and is scheduled to consider reports from the following eight States parties: **Botswana**, **Egypt**, **Malawi**, **Netherlands**, **Panama**, **the United Arab Emirates**, **Ukraine and Uzbekistan**.

#### **46**<sup>th</sup> session

The 46<sup>th</sup> session will meet in 2010 to consider reports of the following six States parties: **Albania, Australia, Fiji, Papua New Guinea, the Russian Federation, and Turkey.** The presession working group for the 46<sup>th</sup> session tasked with preparing the lists of issues and questions for these States parties will meet from 10 to 14 August 2009 in New York. At its 46<sup>th</sup> or 47<sup>th</sup> session, the Committee will also consider the implementation of the Convention in the absence of a report in the Central African Republic, Grenada, and Seychelles.
