## Violence against Women

 UN TRUST FUND ALERTDrastic Shortfall in Resources Threatens Women's Safety

## Dear Friend,

When her husband beat her, he would do it with whatever he could lay his hands on. If she tried to run away, he would come after her and throw stones and knives. When he caught her, he would brutally beat her in front of everyone. She married him at the age of thirteen, on the advice of her grandmother, in the hope of escaping the relentless abuse inflicted by her father and step-mother, only to be abused again - this time by her husband.

The story of this woman from Bhutan is not unique: $\mathbf{1}$ to $\mathbf{6}$ in every 10 women experience physical and/or sexual violence by men at some point in their lifetime, most often perpetrated by husbands and intimate partners. For some women, the abuse ends in death.

Violence against women and girls is a global pandemic of alarming proportions. It happens in every country in the world, cutting across boundaries of age, race, culture or wealth. It takes place in the home, on the streets, in schools, the workplace, in farm fields, refugee camps and in times of war and conflict.

And in times of uncertainty, such as the current global financial crisis, women and girls are at greatest risk of abuse, violence and exploitation.
