KEY POINTS FOR ACTION

Women's advocates are urged to raise the following recommendations with Members of Parliament, Senators and candidates for the 2010 federal election, and remind them that the following elements must be essential to the plan:

Recommendations

Australia should pledge core, predictable, and multi-year voluntary funds now for the new Composite Entity for Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment and continue to o er strong moral support for the new entity. Further, Australia should advocate in support of recognition of the vital role that civil society, particularly women's
